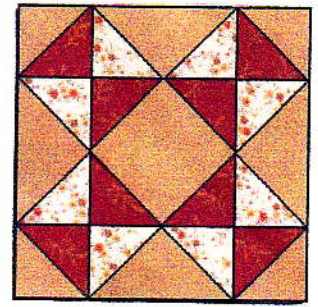


LIVINGSTON PIECEMAKERS QUILT GUILD

BLOCK OF THE MONTH JULY, 2012

FOUR PATCH FOX AND GOOSE – 12"

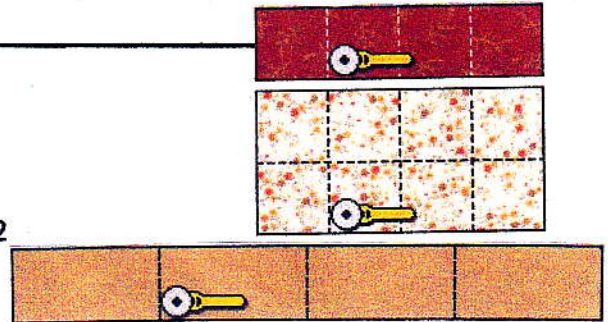


Supply list

Color one needs one (red or blue) 3-1/2"x14" strip and one 3-7/8"x 7-3/4" strip  
Color two (white muslin from Jean's Corner) needs one 7"x 14" strip  
Color three needs one (blue or red) 6-1/2" square and one 3-1/2"x 26" strip and one 3-7/8"x 7-3/4" strip

Cut the color one 3-1/2"x 14" strip into four 3-1/2" squares.  
Cut the color two 7"x14" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares.

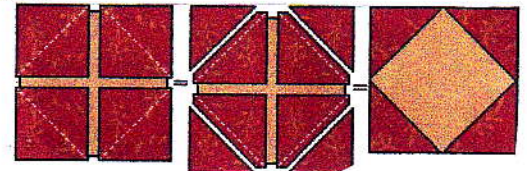
Cut the color three 3-1/2"x 26" strip into four 3-1/2" by 6-1/2" rectangles.



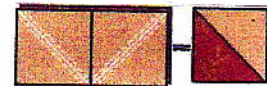
To make the flying geese unit, place a color two square right sides together atop a color three rectangle, with outer edges aligned. On the back of the top square lightly mark the diagonal. Sew on this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the corner. Repeat this with another color two square on the other end of the rectangle. Make four geese in the same way.



In the same manner as in the step above, sew color one squares to the four corners of the color three 6-1/2" square to make the blocks center unit.



Next speed piece the half squares by stacking the color one and the color three 3-7/8"x 7-3/4" strips, right sides together and all edges aligned. On the back of the top strip lightly mark the 3-7/8" square line and mark the diagonals in the direction shown at right. Now sew a scant 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the square line. Now cut apart on the marked diagonals and on the 3-78" square line. This will give you four half squares. Press seam allowances toward the darker fabric. Trim these back to measure 3-1/2" if needed.



Then just lay out all units as shown at right. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom row seams to the center and the middle row seam to the outside. Sew the rows together and you are all done.
